Windows Login

When you switch your computer on, do you login with a user name and password ?

If not, you could be at serious risk. These days of more and more user accounts, you of course need to remember, lots of passwords. Not only to get into your on-line banking, but also to get into Paypal, Skype, and Facebook, to name a few.
