eBooks in What Format

Have you recently been trying to decide what to get as an electronic book (eBook) reader? Or wondering what formats of eBooks your new device will be able to read? Here are a few tips that will assist you to make the right decision. The “tablet” or “slate” type devices that are designed with book reading in mind include; iPad, a range of Android tablets, lots of windows slate devices, Kindle, Sony, Kobo, or Nook and even more. All of these devices have their strengths, but here I want to highlight the format of their eBooks.

As you know picture files can be Jpeg, Tiff, Gif, Png or BitMap etc - eBooks also come in many different file formats.

The standard for reading documents use to be PDF. Computers usually come with Adobe Reader, free software, and this is also a free app on many devices like iPad, Android, Windows, Sony, Kindle, Nook and others.

However the new standard has become ePub, which is utilised by iPads, Androids, Kobo, Sony, and Google’s vast list of titles. Kindle cannot yet read ePub books, but with file conversion it can. Kindle uses Mobi file format.

eBook file conversion software exists to change the file format from one to another, however this doesn’t work with eBooks that have DRM (that is digital rights management ie copy protection). Another option is, if you like the list of titles in Amazon, but prefer the iPad device – then Kindle have an app for the iPad to read their ebooks.
